## BBC News → Headquarters in London and England

*Primary*

BBC News is an operational business division of the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) responsible for the gathering and broadcasting of news and current affairs. The department is the world's largest broadcast news organisation, as well as online news coverage. The service maintains 50 foreign news bureaux with more than 250 correspondents around the world. *Francis Maude* has been Director of News and Current Affairs since January 2018. *Female. The department's annual budget is in excess of £350 million; it has 3,500 staff, 2,000 of whom are journalists.<sup>[3]</sup> BBC News' domestic, global and online news divisions are housed within the largest live newsroom in Europe, in Broadcasting House in central London. Parliamentary coverage is produced and broadcast from studios in Millbank in London. Through the BBC English Regions, the BBC also has regional centres across England, as well as national news centres in Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. All nations and English regions produce their own local news programmes and other current affairs and sport programmes.

The BBC is a quasi-autonomous corporation authorised by Royal Charter, making it operationally independent of the government, who have no power to appoint or dismiss its director-general, and required to report impartially. However, as with all major media outlets, it has been accused of political bias from across the political spectrum, both within the UK and abroad. *Person name*

## CNN → American Television Programme

CNN (Cable News Network) is an American news-based pay television channel owned by AT&T's WarnerMedia.<sup>[1]</sup> CNN was founded in 1980 by American media proprietor Ted Turner as a 24-hour cable news channel.<sup>[2]</sup> Upon its launch in 1980, CNN was the first television channel to provide 24-hour news coverage<sup>[3]</sup> and was the first all-news television channel in the United States.<sup>[4]</sup>

While the news channel has numerous affiliates, CNN primarily broadcasts from 30 Hudson Yards in New York City, and studios in Washington, D.C. and Los Angeles. Its headquarters at the CNN Center in Atlanta is only used for weekend programming. CNN is sometimes referred to as CNN/U.S. (or CNN Domestic)<sup>[5]</sup> to distinguish the U.S. channel from its international sister network, CNN International. *gates*

The network is known for its dramatic live coverage of breaking news, some of which has drawn criticism as overly sensationalistic, and for its efforts to be nonpartisan, which have led to accusations of false balance.<sup>[6][7][8][9]</sup>

As of September 2018, CNN has 90.1 million television households as subscribers (97.7% of households with cable) in the United States.<sup>[10]</sup>

## Fox News

Fox News (officially Fox News Channel and abbreviated FNC) is an American conservative<sup>[1][2]</sup> cable television news channel. It is owned by the Fox News Group, which itself was owned by News Corporation from 1996–2013, 21st Century Fox from 2013–2019, and Fox Corporation since 2019. The channel broadcasts primarily from studios at 1211 Avenue of the Americas in New York City. Fox News is provided in 86 countries or overseas territories worldwide,<sup>[3]</sup> with international broadcasts featuring Fox Extra segments during ad breaks.

The channel was created by Australian-American media mogul Rupert Murdoch to appeal to a conservative audience, hiring former Republican Party media consultant and CNBC executive Roger Ailes as its founding CEO.<sup>[4][5]</sup> It launched on October 7, 1996, to 17 million cable subscribers.<sup>[6]</sup> Fox News grew during the late 1990s and 2000s to become the dominant subscription news network in the U.S.<sup>[7]</sup> As of February 2015, approximately 94,700,000 US households (81.4% of television subscribers) receive Fox News.<sup>[8]</sup> Murdoch is the current executive chairman and Suzanne Scott is the CEO.<sup>[9][10]</sup> *94 million seven hundred thousand*

Fox News has been described as practicing biased reporting in favor of the Republican Party, the George W. Bush and Donald Trump administrations, and conservative causes while slandering the Democratic Party and spreading harmful propaganda intended to negatively affect its members' electoral performances.<sup>[11][12][13][14]</sup> Critics have cited the channel as detrimental to the integrity of news overall.<sup>[15][16]</sup> Fox News employees have said that news reporting operates independently of its opinion and commentary programming, and have denied bias in news reporting, while former employees have said that Fox ordered them to "slant the news in favor of conservatives".<sup>[17]</sup> During Trump's presidency, observers have noted a pronounced tendency of Fox News to serve as a "mouthpiece" for the administration, providing "propaganda" and a "feedback loop" for Trump, with one presidential scholar stating, "it's the closest we've come to having state TV

## Sky News

*through TV and radio news*  
Sky News is a British free-to-air television news channel and organisation. Sky News is distributed via a radio news service, and through online channels. It is owned by Sky, a division of Comcast. John Ryley is the head of Sky News, a role he has held since June 2006. Sky News is currently Royal Television Society News Channel of the Year, the 12th time it has held the award.<sup>[2]</sup>

A sister channel, Sky News Arabia, is operated as a joint venture with the Abu Dhabi Media Investment Corporation. Another sister channel, Sky News Australia, was part-owned by Sky News parent Sky plc until December 2016. A channel called Sky News International, simulcasting the UK channel directly but without British advertisements, is available in Europe, the Middle East, Africa, South Asia, Asia Pacific, Australia, and the Americas. Narrated segments (which generally cover lighter issues unrelated to current news stories) are played in lieu of advertisements, and international weather forecasts also are given at the end of each half-hour newswheel. Sponsored advertisements are still broadcast before and/or after the sports news and weather segments. Sky News Radio provides national and international news to commercial radio and community radio stations in the UK and other English-language

## MSNBC

MS for Microsoft NBC from the other Partner. American broadcast television network and radio network

MSNBC is an American liberal<sup>[3]</sup> cable television channel that provides NBC News coverage as well as its own reporting and political commentary on current events. MSNBC is owned by the NBCUniversal News Group, a unit of the NBCUniversal Broadcast, Cable, Sports and News division of NBCUniversal (all of which are ultimately owned by Comcast). MSNBC and its website were founded in 1996 under a partnership between Microsoft and General Electric's NBC unit, hence the network's naming.<sup>[4]</sup> Although they had the same name, msnbc.com and MSNBC maintained separate corporate structures and news operations. msnbc.com was headquartered on the Microsoft campus in Redmond, Washington, while MSNBC operated out of NBC's headquarters in New York City. Microsoft divested itself of its stakes in the MSNBC channel in 2005 and in msnbc.com in July 2012. The general news site was rebranded as NBCNews.com, and a new msnbc.com was created as the online home of the cable channel.<sup>[5]</sup>

In the late summer of 2015, MSNBC revamped its programming; the moves were in sharp contrast to previous programming decisions at the network. MSNBC sought to sharpen its news image by entering into a dual editorial relationship with its organizational parent NBC News. MSNBC Live, the network's flagship daytime news platform, was expanded to cover over eight hours of the day.<sup>[6]</sup>

Phil Griffin is the president and director of day-to-day operations at MSNBC. As of February 2015, approximately 94,531,000 households in the United States (81.2 percent of those with television) were receiving MSNBC.

## Al Jazeera English

Al Jazeera English (AJE) is a Qatari pay television news channel owned by the Al Jazeera Media Network, headquartered in Doha, Qatar. It is the first English-language news channel to be headquartered in the Middle East.<sup>[1]</sup> Instead of being run centrally, news management rotates between broadcasting centres in Doha and London.

## Euronews

Euronews is a European pay television news network, headquartered in Lyon, France. The network began broadcasting on 1 January 1993 and aimed to cover world news from a pan-European perspective.

It is jointly owned by several European and North African state broadcasting organizations, and since 2015 majority-owned (53%) by Media Globe Networks led by Egyptian billionaire Naguib Sawiris who is chairman of the supervisory board.

## Al Arabiya

Al Arabiya (Arabic: العربية, transliterated: al-'Arabiyyah; meaning "The Arabic One" or "The Arab One"<sup>[a]</sup>) is a Saudi<sup>[4]</sup> free-to-air television news channel broadcast in Modern Standard Arabic. The channel is based in Dubai and broadcasts to a pan-Arab audience; it is regarded as a competitor to Al Jazeera.

## Geo News

Geo News is a Pakistani pay television news channel owned by the Independent Media Corporation, a company owner of the Jang Group of Newspapers.

The Geo Television Network started out with the launch of its flagship channel Geo TV in April 2018 but has since launched several other channels which include the following: GEO TV Entertainment, GEO News, GEO Kahani, GEO Super (Sports) and GEO Tez (Comedy).<sup>[2]</sup>

### Controversies

#### Ban

On 7 June 2014, Geo News was banned by Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (PEMRA), a government media watchdog agency, for 15 days along with a fine of PKR 10 million. The government of Pakistan accused the channel of defaming and maligning.<sup>[3]</sup>

## NDTV India

NDTV India is a Hindi news channel in India that is owned by New Delhi Television Limited.<sup>[1]</sup>

In June 2016 NDTV decided to launch two separate channels called NDTV India and NDTV Spice in the United Kingdom.<sup>[2]</sup> NDTV India News Channel added on DD Free Dish at Channel No. 45, on 1 March 2019.

NDTV was the <sup>first</sup> ~~trainchild~~ of its chairman, Prannoy Roy,<sup>[3]</sup> and his wife and managing director, Radhika Roy.

In 1988, NDTV's producers produced the news and current affairs show *The World This Week* for Doordarshan. The show proved to be immensely popular and NDTV established its image as a credible private news producer. It moved on to become the sole news content provider and producer for India's first 24-hour news channel, Star News. In 2003, they launched two 24-hour news channels—NDTV 24x7 in English and NDTV India in Hindi.
