

Famous Personalities in Urdu Poetry and Prose

These poets infused Urdu expressions and words seamlessly into lyrics, *ghazals* and *shayaris*, making them not only easier to understand, but also enabling us to slowly fall in everlasting love with the language.

So here is a list of poets of different eras, who have been a major reason why we fell in love with the language in the first place.

1. Mirza Ghalib

Mirza Ghalib Poetry - Mirza Ghalib is regarded as a renowned poet of not just Urdu but also the Persian language. The reason is that he did the great contribution for both languages. His poems and proses are vastly quoted in literature festivals and events. His personality was so intense as several movies are also written on his character. As a member of falling Mughal Empire and old landed aristocracy, he not worked for Mughal emperors. He had himself remarked during his lifetime that he would be recognized by later generations.

2. Faiz Ahmad Faiz

Faiz Ahmad Faiz and his work truly touches the human heart. He evokes emotions because his poetry is rarely without an accompanying haunting quality of pain. If there is someone who understands loss of love, it has to be Faiz *saab*.

3. Gulzar

The extent of Gulzar's excellence as a poet, lyricist and writer can never be mapped. Gulzar adapted his writing with the changing times, but the capability to evoke human emotions was and will always be the cornerstone of all his works. Picking a single song to represent him is impossible, but this work comes pretty close.

4. Sahil Ludhianvi

Popularly known as Sahir, Sahil Ludhianvi was an amazing Urdu poet, who also penned some classic songs for Bollywood. His work is still remembered, and oft recited, by budding poets and admirers alike.

5. Parveen Shakir

Sadly there have not been many women Urdu poets who've achieved the same level of fame as their male contemporaries, but Parveen Shakir and her work definitely stands out. There are few poets who've managed to equally excel in free verse and technical *ghazal* style, and Parveen Shakir is definitely one of them.

6. Ahmad Faraz

Faraz's works gained immense popularity, to the point that he was considered to be second only to Faiz Ahmed Faiz. The reason is simple - his works express the anguish, joy and simplicity of love in a way few other poets have been able to.

7. Mir Taqi Mir

Mir is the 18th century poet who is often credited with giving shape and structure to Urdu language itself. Often remembered as the 'God of Poetry', he was a pioneer of the Urdu poetry form of *ghazal*. Urdu poetry is incomplete without the name of Mir Taqi Mir and his contribution is widely acknowledged for not just the Urdu poetry but for the whole Urdu language. Mir Taqi Mir's philosophy was developed primarily due to his father, who has a large following. His father's focus on the significance of love and value of compassion seems much visible in the poetry of Mir Taqi Mir and also his life.

He was born in 1253 A.D. in Patiyala, India. Amir Khusro was educated in theology, Persian and the Quran.

11. Abul Kalam Azad Poetry in Urdu

Abul Kalam Azad Poetry - Abul Kalam Muhiyuddin Ahmed Azad aka Abul Kalam Azad was a political leader, social activist, scholar, writer and poet of Indian Independence Movement. Maulana Azad is regarded as one of the greatest writer of 20th century. He used 'Azad' as his pen name and did all of his poetry using this name. The initially drafted poem of Abul Kalam Azad titled "Armaghan-e-Farakh" was published in Bombay magazine. He is the author of various books including Ghubar-e-Khatir, India Wins Freedom, Tazkirah, Tarjumanul Quran, to name a few. The most significant work of Abul Kalam Azad is the narration of Ghubar-e- Khatir which comprise of only 24 letters and addressed to Maulana Habibur Rahman Khan Sherwani. His contribution to Urdu poetry is remarkable. Maulana Azad is regarded as one of the founders of Jamia Millia Islamia.

12. Ahmad Nadeem Qasmi Poetry in Urdu

Ahmad Nadeem Qasmi Poetry – Whenever, we talk about the Urdu poetry of late twentieth century, then the name of Ahmed Nadeem Qasmi will surely come. However, he was not the poet but also the short story author, journalist, literary critic, and Pakistani poet. He wrote books on different topics and in different genres.

Ahmad Nadeem Qasmi edited different literary journals, including Tehzeeb-i-Niswaan, Savera, Phool, Adab-i-Lateef, Funoon, and Naqoosh. He also worked as the editor of Imroze. Ahmad Nadeem Qasmi also contributed for different weekly columns and national newspapers such as Daily Jang and Rawan Dawan for a long time period. His poetry included modern nazms and traditional gahazals.

13. Allama Iqbal Poetry in Urdu

Allama Iqbal Poetry – Poet of the East, Allama Iqbal needs no introduction. He is the most celebrated poet, philosopher, barrister and scholar of all times. Allama Iqbal received the title of "Sir" from King George V in 1922. Apart from being the poet of the East, Allama Iqbal also

enjoys the status of “Musawir e Pakistan”, “Hakeem-ul-Ummat” and “Mufakir e Pakistan”. He became the national poet of Pakistan after independence. His popular creation “Sare Jahan se Acha” became the national song of India. The birth anniversary of Allama Iqbal is celebrated as the national holiday in Pakistan.

Regarded as the spiritual father of Pakistan, Allama Iqbal possess prominent place in the Urdu poetry and literature. Allama Iqbal poetry collections reveal his wisdom and intellectualism that had motivated the Muslims of India for struggle of freedom. **Allama Iqbal shayari** has been narrated in Urdu and Persian languages. 14. Altaf Hussain Hali Poetry in Urdu

wrote for many subjects like patriotism, biography, Sufism and criticism. He was a great writer and poet of his times. The British awarded him with the title “Shams-ul-Ulema” which means the sun of scholars. It was a great achievement of Altaf Hussain Hali.

15. Amjad Islam Amjad Poetry in Urdu

Amjad Islam Amjad Poetry – Amjad Islam Amjad birthplace is Lahore, Punjab. Some people do not need introduction as their name is itself a description of their work recognition.
