SLANG: IS OFTEN USED BY PEOPLE IN A GROUP THAT ARE FAMILIAR WITH IT LIKE TEENAGERS.

MAKES SPEECH MORE EMOTIONALLY EXPRESSIVE AND SHORTER.

SLANG: IS USUALLY TABOO WHEN SPEAKING TO PEOPLE OF HIGHER SOCIAL STATUS


# Examples of slangs

DUDE - GUY. HEY DUDE,

WHAT'S UP? = HI, WHAT ARE YOU DOING.

RIDE - CAR. YOU LIKE MY NEW RIDE? = DO YOU LIKE MY NEW CAR?

JACKED - STOLEN. THAT DUDE JACKED MY RIDE! = THAT GUY STOLE MY CAR



BRO - “BROTHER” MEANING FRIEND. HEY  
BRO WHAT’S GOING ON? = HI, WHAT ARE  
YOU DOING?

UBER - THE ULTIMATE. THAT NEW CAR IS  
UBER COOL. = THAT NEW CAR IS SUPER  
COOL





# Common English Slangs

**Gonna**

*Going to*

Be careful! you are **gonna** fall.

**Watcha**

*What are you*

**Whatcha** thinking?

**Outta**

*Out of*

He got **outta** the taxi.

**Kinda**

*Kind of*

It was **kinda** nice to see her again.

**Gimme**

*Give me*

I beg you, **gimme** a chance, please.

**Dunno**

*Don't know*

He **dunno** how much I love her.

**Wanna**

*Want to*

I **wanna** race cars.

**Gotta**

*Have got to*

You have **gotta** come here immediately.
