INTRANSITIVE VERBS

**A sentence with an
INTRANSITIVE VERB only has a
SUBJECT and a VERB.**

The subject is the person (or
thing) that is doing the action.

EXAMPLES

☐ Alvaro is reading.



MORE EXAMPLES

☐ Fabriccio is sleeping.

aAndrea is laughing. 

Axel is playing.

Krystel ate.

a Fiorella sings.

TRANSITIVE VERBS

A sentence with a
TRANSITIVE VERB has a
SUBJECT, a VERB and a
DIRECT OBJECT.

A direct object is the person (or thing) that is acted upon by the subject.

EXAMPLES

C] Edie is doing his homework.



MORE EXAMPLES

☐ Ariana drank a cup of coffee.

- ❑ I have made a sandwich.
- ❑ Martin is playing PS3.
- ❑ Elisandra prepares pineapple marmalade.

**HOW TO
FIND A
DIRECT
OBJECT?**

1.- Say the subject and verb followed by the question What? or Whom?.

2.- The answer is the direct object.

TRANSITIVE**VERB**

3.- There is no answer, there is no direct object.

INTRANSITIVE**VERB**

EXERCISES

❑ A child is eating a sandwich.

1. A child is eating Who or What?
2. Sandwäch is the direct object.
Therefore "eating" is transitive.
