

## Psychoanalytical Theory

- Psychoanalytical theory by Sigmund Freud.
- He organized the structure of the personality into three major components'...Id, Ego, Superego
- Sigmund Freud 's psychoanalytic theory of personality argues that human behavior is the result of the interactions among three component parts of the mind: the id, ego, and superego.

## Specifications

### Id:

- Id operates on the pleasure principle
- Present at Birth

### Ego:

- Ego operates on the Reality principle
- Developed after birth

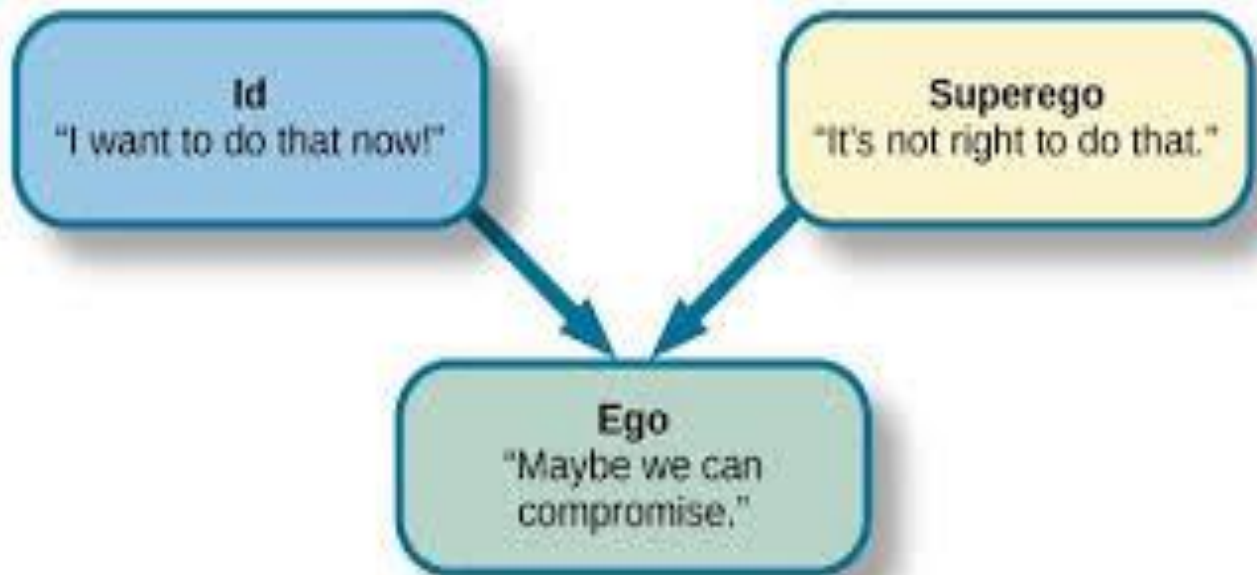
### Superego:

- Superego operates on the Morality principle
- Developed from 5 to 6 age
- Opposite of Id

## Definitions

- **Id:** “Which is the idea that every wishful impulse should be satisfied immediately, regardless of the consequences.”
- **Ego:** “The part of the mind that that mediates b/w the conscious & the unconscious and is responsible for reality testing & a sense of personal identity.”
- **Superego:** “The part of a person mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers.”
