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COMPREHENSION

Introduction:-

➤ Comprehension is a very important part of the paper to test the student's command over the language as well as his capacity to put across his ideas in a symbol but correct and forceful language.

➤ Comprehension is part of the skill of reading acquisition. But without it, all the other skills become skills without meaning.

Definitions of Reading Comprehension

- Comprehension is “intentional thinking during which meaning is constructed through interactions between text and reader” (Harris and Hodges, 1995).

Definitions of comprehension

- Comprehension is a process in which readers construct meaning by interacting with text through the combination of prior knowledge and previous experience, information in the text, and the stance the reader takes in relationship to the text (Pardo, 2004).

Comprehension

- Making meaning
- Visual- recognising and interpreting print, images, symbols, diagrams etc
- Auditory- comprehending sounds, words, music

➤ Kinaesthetic – understanding body language, actions, behaviours

➤ All of these can come together to create optimum comprehension of situations, texts, experiences

PRECISE WRITING

Introduction:-

- Precise may be defined as a brief summary of the main points and ideas of writing or speech.
- The precise is a type of summarizing.

Characteristics of a good precise

1. Clarity
2. Correctness
3. Objectivity
4. Coherence
5. Completeness
6. Conciseness

Writing a Precise

- A precise is a condensed restatement of an article, roughly $\frac{1}{4}$ the length of the original or less.
- In contrast to a summary, a precise should preserve the article's logic and emphases, and include main examples where relevant.

A precise of a primary-literature scientific paper should follow the standard format:
background/hypothesis, methods, results, conclusion.

The precise should be written from the original author's point of view, without editorializing.

Writing a Precise

1. Read the article carefully all the way through
2. Consider the main points
3. Go over the article again, jotting down the main points (NOT whole sentences)

4 . Seam together the points, in order, in a logical narrative

5 . Edit to place proper stress on main points, cut out extra details
